

Planned Giving: Creating a statement of your values.

Planned giving is a simple but effective way to leave a gift. There are several types of gifts you can include in your estate planning documents. With the help of an estate planning attorney, and the language we provide on our website, you can be assured that your gift will be honored and appreciated.

There are three types of bequests you can make: 1) outright, 2) residual/remainder; and 3) contingent. Here is some suggested language:

Outright:

I give, devise, and bequeath to Washington Women In Need (WWIN), a nonprofit charitable organization, located at *(address)* and further identified by tax id number 91-1559848, _____ percent of my estate (or alternatively, the sum of \$_____) to support *(list a specific project or if the gift is unrestricted, “for WWIN’s general use and purpose” or “an unrestricted gift to be used in the area of the greatest need at the time the gift is received.”)*

Residual/Remainder:

I give, devise, and bequeath to Washington Women In Need (WWIN), a nonprofit charitable organization, located at *(address)* and further identified by tax id number 91-1559848, _____ percent of my residual/remainder estate. *(Then indicate whether the gift is restricted or unrestricted as listed above.)*

Contingent:

I give, devise, and bequeath to my daughter 50% of my estate, however, if my daughter does not survive me, I bequeath 50% of my estate to Washington Women In Need (WWIN), a nonprofit charitable organization, located at *(address)* and further identified by tax id number 91-1559848. *(Then indicate whether the gift is restricted or unrestricted as listed above.)*
